

Who must complete this declaration?

This declaration must be completed by individuals who practise or have the training to practise a trade or profession which corresponds to a regulated trade or profession in Québec:

- Professions regulated by a professional order (**except for physicians, who must consult and sign the *Declaration by an international medical graduate wishing to practise medicine in Québec***);
- Trades and occupations in the construction industry (regulated by the Commission de la construction du Québec);
- Occupational qualifications regulated by Emploi-Québec (regulated qualifications outside the construction industry);
- Occupations in the financial and insurance sector (regulated by the Autorité des marchés financiers).

Steps to take:

To learn if you must sign this declaration, consult the list of regulated trades and professions appearing on the back of this page.

If your trade or profession is on the list, please read the declaration below, complete and sign it, attach the original to your file and keep a copy.

- that I have taken note of the steps to take and conditions to fulfill to obtain a legal authorization to practise my trade or profession in Québec. The steps are presented on the website: www.immigration-quebec.gouv.qc.ca/en/employment/regulated-professions/index.html.
- that I have been informed of the difficulty faced by a candidate practising a regulated trade or profession in Québec to meet the requirements for obtaining legal authorization to practise my trade or profession in Québec.

Accordingly, I understand that:

- obtaining a Québec certificate of selection (CSQ) does not guarantee that I will receive authorization to practise my trade or profession in Québec
- a diploma or permit to practise obtained outside Québec does not automatically give me the right to practise my trade or profession in Québec
- in order to practise my trade or profession in Québec, or to use a reserved trade qualification, I must obtain an authorization to practise from the regulatory body that governs the practise of my trade or profession in Québec, and that to obtain this authorization to practise, I must submit to the requirements established by this body and that I may not meet these requirements or may only partially meet them;
- I must communicate as soon as possible with the competent regulatory body in Québec if I intend to practise my trade or profession in Québec
- I may have difficulty registering for supplemental training in order to meet the standards established by this regulatory body in order to eventually obtain the right to practise my trade or profession in Québec;
- in order to practise a profession governed by a professional order in Québec, I must **pass the French language exam** if I cannot provide proof, pursuant to Article 35 of the Charter of the French Language (C-11), that I have an appropriate knowledge of this language.
